Congratulations to the many regions who have held their regional competitive events, and to those who have yet to compete, I wish you the best of luck. This month, I would like to better introduce you to the five general types of motions.

Main Motions introduce subjects for consideration, they cannot be made when another motion is before the assembly. They yield to privileged, subsidiary and incidental motions.

Subsidiary Motions change or affect how the main motion is handled. They are voted on before the main motion.

Privileged Motions concern special matters not related to pending business. Generally they are considered before other motions.

Incidental Motions are questions of procedure that arise out of other motions. They must be considered before the other motion.

Motions that bring a question again before the assembly enable certain items to be reconsidered. Generally, they are brought up when no business is pending.
